A team of experts including law enforcement, family & victim advocacy programs (SARP, Green Haven Family Advocates, Victim/Witness), medical professionals, child protective services, prosecution, and mental health professionals work together to conduct a single forensic interview for each child. Additionally, each team ensures that no child is re-victimized at any time during the investigation, treatment, management, and prosecution of child abuse cases.

The Child Advocacy Center will be moving to a new, larger location and are in need of supplies to make this environment safe for the children. In conjunction with the Craft 4 A Cause event, we are doing a supply drive to help gather materials that can be used.

#### ELCA Stories of Faith in Action: Grateful for God's Creatures

Horses, peacocks, chickens, snakes, parrots, dogs, cats, lizards, tortoises and fish at church?

It's not unusual or too exotic for the annual Blessing God's Creatures Festival at First Lutheran Church and School in Torrance, Calif. First Lutheran welcomes animal lovers from all over the South Bay of Los Angeles to recognize God's calling to care for the world God has made — including all creatures. Their fifth-annual Blessing God's Creatures Festival was held on Oct. 5 this year. Jared Carson, pastor at First Lutheran Church and School, explains, "We always choose the first Saturday in October for this annual event for consistency in our parish schedule, but it also happens to be the closest weekend to the commemoration of St. Francis of Assisi."

The event has become well-known in the South Bay community. It really is a festival, with a petting zoo, pony rides and a bounce-house for children. Pet businesses and pet nonprofit groups, such as pet adoption groups, animal rescues, no-kill shelters and fostering programs, are invited to be festival exhibitors, offering their expertise, services and information in caring for animals — of all kinds.

On the main stage area of the outdoor courtyard, a wildlife biologist showcases exotic animals and talks about their habitat, food and care. Even with the festival atmosphere, the heart of the festival is the pastoral blessings that happen in the courtyard away from the noise and busyness of the exhibitors, main stage and children's activities.

#### A blessing for all

Here in the shade and quiet of the congregation's courtyard, pets and their human companions receive personal blessings from one of the pastors.

The pastors offer words of assurance to pet owners that God is blessing their beloved pets with health, life, love and a caring home. People receive the assurance that God is blessing them with animal companions as a sign of God's love and faithfulness. For many people, they have never heard these words of blessing, and it can be emotional for some pet owners.

"Our pets are those who comfort us when we are sad, bring us joy and laughter, and love us even when we can't love ourselves. By God's grace, they are as much of a blessing to us as we are to them," says Jared.

#### A witness to all

Without a doubt, there is an element of community witness and outreach through this event — welcoming more than 500 people this year. A few people have joined the congregation because of this event. Others simply find a new-found appreciation and respect for this community of Christian faith. Jared knows they are making a public impact when he runs into people in the community and they hear he's a pastor at First Lutheran. "They get a big smile on their face and say, 'That's the church that does the big animal-blessing event." "While our congregation actively engages in forming disciples, I take encouragement that this festival isn't a 'bait and switch membership drive.' We are authentic in our witness to the faith and this builds good will with our neighbors." "Maybe this is the best first step toward being a relevant Christian community in a new context."
